Sometimes there are exceptions to the rule so please contact us to see if your book qualifies. There are five points to every review which equals the star system on amazon:

- 1. The presentation of your book: This point is mainly about how your book is presented and how it looks. If there are formatting issues with the interior of your book, that is taken into account. Sometimes, a poor formatting can turn off a reader.
- 2. The bibliography: More than the style of citations you use, this point is made with the attempt to keep the book even sided. If you are writing a book about a section of battle or the battle itself, there should be an even amount of sources for your book. If you are writing a biography, there will be more sources for one side than the other, but still should be an evenly written work.
- 3. The narrative: The narrative is rated on the inspiration and ease of reading it brings to the audience.
- 4. Level of scholarship: Does your book bring something new to the table of study with the Gettysburg Campaign or the person or regiment you are writing about? If it does, the level of scholarship is present in your work.
- 5. Accessibility: Is your work available to the general public or is it a work which is limited making it more difficult for people to get your book? If your work is kindle published only, it is not as accessible to the public unless the author has a promise to release a print version in the future.

The Gettysburg Chronicle, as stated before, reviews any work on the Battle of Gettysburg. The last thing which should be mentioned is the date of publication. We work here to assure that the reviews are fairly recent. Therefore, we review books published within the past ten years since most works past that point have plenty of reviews. It would not be a good source of our time to review an old book. The review is published on the Gettysburg Chronicle website in a blog form where you can leave comments for us. It is also published on amazon, goodreads, facebook, many of the groups about the Civil War and Gettysburg on facebook and is sent to your publisher. You should know that we publish all reviews good or bad and will not tolerate author backlash. If the author wishes to lash out against the Gettysburg Chronicle because of a review, your actions will be reported to the publisher. If you self publish, your printing company will be contacted.
